At Denton we have put together a Reading Spine, a selection of books, poetry and rhymes that we believe will engage our children, support their imaginative minds and equip our learners with the language needed to become successful writers themselves.

What is a Reading Spine?

A reading spine is a collection of books and poems that have been assembled to provide a comprehensive start to a child's journey into reading. Each book/ poem has been selected because it will support and engage the reader at a deeper level and help them enter the world of story and imagination.

Each Key Stage has their own list of stories and poems which we believe are age appropriate and will engage our readers in the wonderful world of stories and rhyme.

These 'High Quality Texts' are taken from Pie Corbett's essential book lists for schools that he believe help to build a reading community within a school; full of memorable characters, events and steeped in rich vocabulary.

Within our EYFS and Key Stage One classrooms, we also include a Nursery Rhyme Spine. It is well known that nursery rhymes support key developmental skills and can often engage children for hours of creative play. They are a powerful learning source in early literacy and enable children to become interested in the rhythm and patterns of language.
