Cost of Living Support for Families

November 2022

Over the past few months many people in East Sussex have experienced increases in the cost of living. This has left many facing tough decisions about how to spend their money, and many others in need of advice and financial support to afford rent, fuel bills and everyday items. To help with these issues we are continuing to collate local and national resources.

This newsletter is intended as a resource for practitioners to use to support families, it hasn't been created as something to be sent directly to families/residents. The content in it might be useful to inform work with families during casework, when signposting or referring onwards.

Government Support

Household Support Extended

In May, the government announced a further extension of the Household Support Fund which will run from October until the end of March 2023. We will be working with schools, further education, and Early Years providers to issue food vouchers to all families with eligible children/students for the school holidays.

Eligible school pupils should automatically receive HUGGG food vouchers ahead of each holiday. Eligible children with Early Years providers will also receive vouchers to cover this period. For more information on the HUGGG voucher system and how it works, please visit:

DWP - Universal Credit & cost of living payment

Urgent reminder for colleagues working with families or individuals receiving DWP benefits including Universal Credit:



Unfortunately, we have recently had 13 Universal Credit cases where approx. £80,000+ of Universal Credit has been overpaid to claimants open to support services, including Children's Services. In each case, the claimant did not report changes to their circumstances by updating their Universal Credit account and continued to be overpaid every month. In one case, the overpayment was £1000 per month. This money will have to be paid back to DWP.

If you are supporting anyone receiving DWP benefits and you are aware of a change to their circumstances, <u>please remind and encourage them to inform DWP of ANY changes of circumstances</u>.

The claimant has a responsibility to notify DWP of changes, any overpayment of Universal Credit must be paid back, regardless of how they occur. Circumstance changes that should have been updated in these situations were changes to the family unit:

- children no longer in the household
- separation between partners / partner no longer in the household
- new partner joined the household
- changes of address (including move to Emergency, Supported or Temporary Accommodation)
- change of phone numbers or email addresses

Please be aware that only one parent (the claimant with primary care) can be paid benefits for a child. Overpayments will occur both parents receive benefit payments for the same child. This happens when a couple separate and do not update DWP of their change to circumstances.



Universal Credit claimants can log into their claim account and see their monthly statement which gives a full breakdown of their payment including detailing members of the family unit included in the amount. Claimants can also update their circumstances here.

Household Support Fund

Families facing hardship can get help with essential household costs. If you are working within Children's Service Early Help Team, the Household support fund is administered by the Family Focus Team and can help with costs for food, clothing, bedding or health and hygiene.
